Sister Mary Beth Lloyd and the other Sisters are continuing their work to promote the dignity of women and children in some of the poorest countries in the world – and here at home – by providing an education to those who previously had limited opportunities and choices in their lives. More than that, the Sisters also help provide the necessities of life: water, food, shelter, and clothing.

The Triple Crown of Extreme Sports

Let me tell you about my work as a mountain climber. In 2005 I reached the summit of Mount Vinson in Antarctica and the summit of Mount Kosciuszko in Australia, completing my quest for the Seven Summits – reaching the highest point on each of the seven continents.

Taking the message of the Sisters to the top of the world (Mount Everest in 2004) and to the top of each of the Seven Summits provided motivation and meaning

to my quest.

I was honored to carry the Religious Teachers Filippini banner, taking Saint Lucy's message to **Go and Teach**, to the highest point on each continent!

Completing the Seven Summits was the final jewel in the Triple Crown of Extreme Sports. In addition to **mountaineering**, I am one of only three people in the world to have competed in all nine Eco Challenges, a record in **adventure racing**, the second jewel in the crown. My first jewel is **ultra running**. Over my 20-years career I've completed more than 110 races averaging more than 100 miles each, including the Badwater Quad, Solo, and four-time winner. Without the motivation of the fundraising I could not have achieved so much...or it would have meant so little.

Journey 2 Extremes

In July 2005 I will attempt to complete my Journey 2 Extremes – combining my quest for the Seven Summits (**cold, high-altitude mountaineering**) with completing the Badwater 146-mile footrace from minus 282 feet in Death Valley (**hot, desert ultra running**) to the 14,494-foot summit of Mount Whitney. My Journey 2 Extremes includes the following Seven Summits and Badwater...every year.

2002 Denali and Badwater
2003 Aconcagua, Kilimanjaro, and Badwater
2004 Everest, Elbrus, and Badwater
2005 Vinson, Kosciusko, and Badwater

Knowing that you have contributed to the Religious Teachers – making a difference in the lives of the women and children – will provide motivation for me to (hopefully!) complete my record 13th Badwater 146 July 11-13, 2005.

The Work Continues

In September 2005 my wife and I plan to visit one of the missions where the Sisters are making a difference in the world: Hamelmalo, Eritrea. When the Sisters arrived in Hamelmalo in 2004, there were 1,500 children under the age of 5 that needed water, food, shelter, clothing, and an education.

The 200 pregnant women in the village had never been to school and had one of the highest maternal mortality rates in the world. There is now a well in the village to provide water, and the Sisters provide some milk and food to the children every day, as well as daily lessons.

But, there is still work to be done! And not just in Eritrea. The 900 Sisters of the Religious Teachers are also working in Albania, Brazil, England, Ethiopia, India, Ireland, Italy, Switzerland, and the United States. Through your generosity, the Sisters are able to provide aid to underprivileged children and their families
